CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

Dear Members & Colleagues,

I have the pleasure in meeting you all in this year's AGM which will be held at our Bentley Head-Office on Thursday 7th December 2023 at 5.30pm. The financial year ending 30th June 2023 has seen Arche Health operating cautiously in the current economic and political climate.

As advised previously, in August 2021 we purchased vacant land from the City of Canning, with the plan to establish purpose built premises to house our corporate office as well as services focusing on Aboriginal health, pain management and mental health counselling.

The concept design stage started in March 2022 and the final drawings were lodged for development approval (DA) on the 6th of October 2022. Usually, DA would take 90-120 days from lodgement to be approved. In our case, however, the process has taken far longer due to Main Roads WA approvals. We hope to receive DA in January 2024.

The company's ultimate vision for the new development, is to establish a health hub, utilising existing synergies and vertical integration, in an effort to expand our current services. The size of the land offers potential for further development, through collaborative partnerships with organisations who have the same vision as us.

From an operational perspective, we are partly funded and therefore need to focus on being self-sustaining, by improving existing services and encouraging vertical integration. By way of an example, we have recently received registration as a NDIS provider and are exploring opportunities to extend our business, using existing synergies. the

Another example is the Maddington Specialist Centre which we own and operate. We currently have a number of specialists providing services on a regular basis due to an increase in GP referrals. We rely on GP support to ensure that the clinic makes it practical for specialists to continue providing services at the centre whilst also attracting new clinicians with diverse skills. We are encouraged by the difference the centre has made to patients living in the south eastern corridor, particularly those from low socio-economic backgrounds.

Regarding our funded programmes, the Persistent Pain Management Service as well as Aboriginal Integrated Team Care and Wangen Murduin® Services have been extended until 30 June 2024. These services continue to have a high client base and are extremely popular. headspace Armadale and headspace Cannington continue to deliver mental health, vocational, sexual and physical health services to 12-25-year-old clients. Both services are funded until 30 June 2026.

Infocus® Counselling, which provides support to patients with mild to moderate mental health conditions, continues to successfully operate under the Medicare Better Access model whilst relying on the support of GPs to refer. The service, which contracts well respected registered and clinical psychologists, is highly regarded and trusted by local GP's.

I would like to convey my personal gratitude to Dr Jamil Khan, following his retirement from the board this year. Dr Khan has been a board member since 2009 when we still operated under the name of the Canning Division of General Practice (CDGP). On behalf of the board of directors, I wish to thank Dr Khan for his consistent reliability and unwavering support of the organisation during his tenure as board director. His wise and practical advice will be sorely missed. The directors, managers and staff look forward to an exciting year ahead and wish to thank the members for their continued support to our organisation.

CEO'S REPORT

Dear Members, Stakeholders & Staff,

On behalf of the Board of Directors and the Arche Health family, I extend my sincere thanks to all our staff, service partners and funding organisations for their partnership and support over the financial year 2022–2023.

As we reflect on the challenges and successes of the past year, it is clear the commitment to excellence from our staff has remained unwavering despite the challenges thrown at us by the ongoing pandemic, and this continues to be demonstrated by the tireless efforts of our dedicated teams who have provided comprehensive care to people and vulnerable communities across the Perth metropolitan. The statistics speak volumes - more than 76,000 occasions of service, with over 32,000 occasions of service to Aboriginal patients alone.

As we transitioned to living with COVID-19 after a tumultuous 3 years of the pandemic, I'm pleased to see our COVID-19 response remains as one of the best examples, serving as a fitting tribute to our dedicated teams. Western Australia has also been globally recognised for implementing one of the most effective strategies for COVID-19 worldwide. This is a testament to the outstanding work undertaken throughout the pandemic by our staff alongside our partners across the local health sector.

Regarding our existing services, we continue to see more diverse young people seeking support through our adult and youth mental health services. Infocus Counselling Services, which contracts MBS clinicians to provide mental health services, is now officially registered for NDIS providing mental health intervention to NDIS clients with mild to moderate mental health conditions. The counselling service is also a preferred provider for WA Police until 2025 and has a partnership arrangement to see clients referred by the veteran and family counselling service (Open Arms) and Department of Child Protection. Aboriginal Health and our Allied Health services continue to exceed expectations with the number of clients registered to receive support in managing their chronic health conditions with excellent patient health outcomes. Both program areas are currently funded by WAPHA. Our clinical services comprised of the Belvidere Health Centre, day and after-hours, Armadale antenatal, remain sustainable having experienced an increase in patient numbers over the last 12 months. The Maddington Specialist Centre provides unique challenges in terms of workforce with regards to finding specialist physicians.

We also have the pleasure in advising our members that Arche Health continued to project manage the purchased vacant land at 1136 Albany Highway on the corner of Albany Highway and John Street, with a view to commence development within the next year. As you are aware the City of Canning has imposed stringent criteria, which we continue to overcome in order to obtain (DA) approval. The building will be the new head office for Arche Health and will run both current and new primary and allied health services from the premises. The company's ultimate vision is to develop a health hub utilizing existing synergies and vertical integration to improve our service capacity we currently offer, for the benefit of the larger community.



CEO'S REPORT (CONT.)

Health policy challenges continue to evolve, and we are meeting them as best as we can. Our ongoing efforts to address Aboriginal Health issues related to the Closing the Gap initiatives are part of our commitment to safeguarding primary healthcare for our first nations people. This financial year was also a momentous year in completing and launching our Innovate RAP Plan, a great achievement made by the members of our Aboriginal Community Advisory Committee (CAC) led by its chair Ken Hayward.

We are embedding sustainability into our work practices and increasing efficiency across our services. Our workforce will always be a priority, and we are actively working on initiatives to attract the best local talent. We are also committed to retaining our current staff through wellbeing initiatives and development opportunities that foster a lifelong learning and growth mindset and ensure our staff continue to acquire new skills.

I am proud of the work we have accomplished as we strive for a more wholistic health care system.

I am optimistic and look forward to continuing our hard work in the year ahead, building on our successes and accepting new challenges in an ongoing effort to create a healthier community in Perth.
